Navy Seeks to Defend But not exactly how you might think

The Port of Los Angeles Harbor Cup-Cal Maritime Invitational Intercollegiate Regatta hosted by Los Angeles Yacht Club sails the waters around San Pedro from Friday, March 8 to Sunday, March 10

The United States Naval Academy won last year's race and is returning to try to keep its trophy. The race and its related activities are headquartered at Los Angeles Yacht

Ten colleges will compete: the host California Maritime Institute, Cork (Ireland) Institute of Technology, USC, UCLA, UC Santa Barbara, and the Coast Guard, Navy, Maine, and New York Academies, and the College of Charleston.

Racing will take place from about 12:30 p.m. on Friday, March 8 and about 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, March 9 and Sunday, March 10.

The Saturday evening dinner, beginning with cocktails at 6:30 p.m., will feature the noted sailing journalist and commentator Gary Jobson, editor-at-large for *Sailing World* and *Cruising World* magazines. The dinner is open to the public and the deadline for reservations is March 5.

The collegiate teams in the Harbor Cup competition all race one class of boats, Catalina 37s, which means it's the sailors' skills that are tested without any advantage from boat design. Up to 10 races will be held.

The race was established in 2008 and has

become one of the most prestigious collegiate sailing competitions.

Many of the athletes competing in the event stay at the homes or on board the boats of members of Los Angeles Yacht Club.

'Gentlemen Prefer Blondes' featured at Diamonds On The Red Carpet Gala Saturday evening

The Los Angeles Harbor International Film Festival will premiere with its "Read the Book, See the Movie" program featuring *Black Beauty*.

The program promotes literacy and more thoughtful ways to view films, with this year some 600 books being distributed to students throughout the region, who have been reading and discussing it, and they will see the movie at a special morning screening on Thursday, March 14 in the festival's home, the historic Warner Grand Theatre.

The opening night will include a showing of "16 Candles" from 1984 at 7:30 p.m., of course to denote the 16 years that the festival has brought been held.

On Saturday, the festival will present the NewFilmakers LA "On Location The Los Angeles Video Project" showcase of short films that includes 26 shorts. The program begins at noon.

Saturday evening will feature the Hollywood Nostalgia Tribute film "Gentlemen Prefer Blondes" at 7 p.m., preceded by the "Diamonds On The Red Carpet Gala" from 5-6:45 p.m.

Sunday is all documentaries, starting at 1 p.m. with "Rebel With A Cause: The Life of Aiko Herzig Yoshinaga." The film depicts Ms. Yoshinaga's role in gaining restitution for the unlawful imprisonment and confiscation of property and money from Japanese Americans during World War II. Admission is free to this film.

The festival will culminate with "Stories of Los Angeles Harbor Area: For Yesterday, Today & Tomorrow," an oral history project filmed in 2018 that includes interviews to preserve the history of the people and towns in the Harbor region.



Shakespeare by the Sea and Little Fish Theatre: Artistic gems

What started out as a thesis for university turned into a life's work for Lisa Coffi.

She had the idea to put on a true Shakespearean play in the park and searched at length for the right place. When the Los Angeles Department of Recreation & Parks gave her the use of Pt. Fermin Park, she was on her way. The catch was that Parks & Rec said she could not charge for the performance but offered help in securing funds to finance the project. Funding came in readily and the show went on.

Shakespeare by the Sea is in its 22nd season and has soared from 3,000 in attendance to 20,000 and now presents shows in 20 location over the course of 10 weeks with 42 performances, 13 of which are in San Pedro. This year the theatre group will be performing "Henry V" along with "Comedy of Errors." And anyone who's interested in performing can go to the organization's website to find the casting

calls. They always in need of more male actors, she said.

"A Comedy of Errors" opens Thursday, June 13 at San Pedro's Pt. Fermin Park. It's described as "a classic Shakespearean romp of mistaken identity. Two young visitors arrive in the city unaware that their long-lost twins already live there." And the play, set over the course of a single day, has everything go wrong that can.

"Comedy of Errors" opens June 13 and "Henry V" on June 20. All of the Shakespeare by the Sea plays are free admission. The play is known as an inspiring tale of the king who wanted to unite England, which takes him through war and, ultimately, a decisive victory at Agincourt.

And if presenting a festival of the Bard is not enough to keep one busy Lisa along with Associate Artistic Director Suzanne Dean also started Little Fish Theatre, which will mount 15 shows this year. Performances are played in the company's intimate 60-seat theater, which brings the audience along as if they are on the stage.

"The Cemetery Club" is running through March 17. It will be followed by "The Country House" opening on April 4 through April 28. Plus there are several fun single-day theater events throughout the season.



Cabrillo Way Marina Wins Award, Proving It's One of the Very Best

Cabrillo Way Marina has been honored with a 2018 Boaters' Choice Award by marinas.com.

The marina is located in the Outer Harbor at the Port of Los Angeles. It is operated by Westrec Marinas.

The Boaters' Choice Awards recognizes marinas that consistently provide an excellent year-round home for the boating community. Top marinas are determined by boater-audience reviews posted on marinas.com. Online reviews about the Cabrillo Way Marina noted the helpful staff, cleanliness of the marina, new docks, and ease and accessibility of the slips.

Cabrillo Way Marina has 700 slips covering 87 acres of land and water in the West Channel/Cabrillo Beach Recreational Complex of the Port of Los Angeles. It is located south of 22nd and Miner Streets with a nearly mile-long public waterfront promenade. When it was completed in 2011, the \$147.6 million marina was the largest non-terminal construction project ever undertaken by the Port. 


