Everywhere you Turn, San Pedro, the Harbor, Peninsula, and Catalina offer a lot of history. Wellpreserved history. And, fortunately, the history in the area lives, with historically-accurate restoration and knowledgeable docents and historical professionals.

Juan Cabrillo from Portugal discovered San Pedro Bay for the Spanish in 1542.

But there are remnants of the ancient native people who lived and fished here an estimated 3,500 years ago. These are the Tongva people and evidence of their history can

be found at the Los Angeles Unified School District Science Center an at Machado Lake in nearby Harbor City.

And you'll find well-preserved examples of Civil War, Victorian, Art Deco, and later forms of architecture. Just do a little exploring and you'll find yourself in another era.

Pt. Fermin Lighthouse

The Pt. Fermin Lighthouse, built in 1874, was the first navigational light into San Pedro Bay, although the people had been trying to get the government to build one since 1854.

The lighthouse was designed in Stick Style Victorian, a style used in six lighthouses along the California coast. Pt. Fermin's first lighthouse keepers were women, Mary and Ella

It has been completely restored and volunteers from the Point Fermin Lighthouse Society serve as tour guides and help to keep the lighthouse open to the public for tours Tuesday through Sunday 1-4 p.m. Volunteers also maintain the gardens around the lighthouse with many heirloom plants and flowers.

SS Lane Victory

The Lane Victory, pictured on the cover, is a World War II-era Merchant Marine vessel built in 1945 in San Pedro. Today she is a museum on the LA Waterfront and open for tours. The Merchant Marine suffered the greatest percentage of casualties during World War II of any group facing combat.

They were responsible for transporting the personnel, munitions, and food not just for the military effort, but to help U.S. allies survive. And Lane Victory has a proud record of achievement from World War II through the Vietnam War, including its evacuation of thousands during the Korean War.

Today, you can visit throughout the ship, with an extensive museum that also includes exhibits about other Merchant Marine ships and Los Angeles Harbor.

Downtown San Pedro Historic Harbor District

Just above the old Ferry Building, toward Downtown San Pedro, is a structure officially named the City of Los Angeles Municipal Office Building. But everyone knows it as San Pedro City Hall. San Pedro has a part of the City of Los Angeles since 1909.

Construction began on this seven-story Beaux Arts building in 1927. At 112 feet high, it is one of the tallest and most recognizable structures in San Pedro. The seventh floor housed a jail that was nicknamed, "7th Heaven," which is open for visitors.

On the Harbor Blvd. side of the building is Old Fire Station 36, a Los Angeles Fire Department museum that is open on Saturdays from 10 a.m.-3 p.m.

Warner Grand Theatre

Up 6th Street just before Pacific Avenue is the Warner Grand Theatre, a truly grand movie palace from 1931. When film mogul Jack Warner dedicated the theater, he told the assembled audience that it was, "the palace of your dreams."

The Warner Grand Theatre is a carefully-preserved example of Art Deco. Much of the restoration is thanks to the Grand Vision Foundation. The ceiling in the theater's auditorium is made of hand-carved wood and there are many other lavish design elements.

The theater hosts three film festivals—including the San Pedro International Film Festival and LA Harbor International Film Festival—each year, concerts, live performances, the San Pedro City Ballet, Long Beach Opera, Golden State Pops Orchestra, and many other events throughout the year.

Angel's Gate Park: Ft. MacArthur Museum and Angels Gate Cultural Center

Angel's Gate Park is located on what was formerly the Upper Reservation of Ft. MacArthur. The fort was named in honor of Lt. General Arthur MacArthur, Civil War Medal of Honor recipient and father of General Douglas MacArthur.

It was originally a coastal defense site, with big guns to fire shells miles across the ocean at incoming threats.

The history of the facility from 1914 to 1974 lives on at the Ft. MacArthur Museum, which is located in the corridors in the cliffs that were originally part of coastal defense batteries. It has exhibits and displays detailing the military and civil defense of the Los Angeles area.

And the museum sponsors two big events every year. Old Ft. MacArthur Days is a living history and military reenactment event held every July at Angels Gate Park. This year it will be held July 7 and 8 from 10 a.m.-4 p.m.

Every February the museum sponsors the Great Los Angeles Air Raid reenactment. There's a USO-type show and reenactors from the World War II era—and they're all interrupted by the attack of enemy aircraft.

Angels Gate Cultural Center

It would be hard to find a more peaceful use of a former military base than Angels Gate Cultural Center. It's housed in vintage wooden barracks from Ft. MacArthur's time as an active installation.

It's like an arts village with space for 52 artists to work. And it's got extensive gallery space for community engagement through arts education, exhibitions of contemporary art, and cultural events.

The year-round schedule of activities includes gallery exhibitions and community classes. The artists represent nearly every genre, including musicians, ceramists, painters, sculptors, writers, photographers, printmakers and jewelers.

Banning Residence Museum

The Banning Museum is a carefully preserved 23-room residence built in 1864 for Gen. Phineas Banning, founder of the port at Wilmington. He built the elegant structure to demonstrate his confidence in the future of the community and the Union in the midst of the Civil War.

The residence is an outstanding example of domestic Greek Revival architecture in Southern California with 18 rooms open to the public.

On the grounds of the residence, which is in the midst of a 20-acre park, are also the Stagecoach Barn and Gardens.

A visitor center, which originally served as a schoolhouse, is a welcoming point and provides information, along with the starting place for the guided tours by highly-trained docents.

Drum Barracks

California played a bigger role in the Civil War than many people realize. The Drum Barracks Civil War Museum is housed in the last remaining wooden building of a Civil War-era military facility. It was originally the Union Army headquarters in the Southwest (Southern California and the Arizona Territory) from 1861-1871. Drum Barracks, which was first called Camp Drum, served as the main staging, training, and supply base for military operations in the Southwest, and occupied approximately 60 acres of land with an additional 37 acres near the harbor.

Catalina Island: 8,000 Years of History


It's believed Juan Cabrillo was the first European to find Catalina Island, in 1542, the day after he found San Pedro. But it's thought that Native Americans lived there much longer, as long as 8,000 years.

Since the island was discovered, it's created a lot of history. William Wrigley, Jr., the chewing gum executive and owner

of the Chicago Cubs professional baseball team bought the island, and the team held spring training there from 1921 to 1951.

And he built the Avalon Casino, which has nothing to do with gambling, but everything to do with films, live performances, events, and great architecture.

It used to take more than two hours to get there on the Big White



Steamers, the SS Catalina and SS Avalon, But today it takes just about an hour on the fast boats run by Catalina Express.

You can find lots of information about the history of the island from the Catalina Island Museum and all the information you need to visit from the Catalina Island Chamber of Commerce & Visitors Bureau and from Catalina Express.

The Catalina Island Museum currently is showing Houdini: Terror on


the Magic Isle in the The Ada Blanche Wrigley Schreiner Building's Artists' Plaza Gallery through October 7.




